## COVID-19 Update #6

Prior to the COVID-19 crisis, the District of Ucluelet had prepared a draft budget for public consideration, most recently endorsed by Council at the March 12, 2020 Special Meeting of Council. The impacts of COVID-19 have significantly impacted this draft budget and staff are now working to present revisions to Council at the Regular Council Meeting on April 28, 2020 at 3:30pm. Members of the public are encouraged to watch this meeting on the <u>District's YouTube Channel</u> to ensure social distancing practices are continued. The revised budget will be posted on the <u>District's webpage</u> as a part of the Council agenda package on Friday, April 24<sup>th</sup> and the District will be seeking resident feedback thereafter. Please note that property tax collection and due dates are mandated by the Province. District staff, along with many other communities, have been actively communicating with the Province requesting measures be taken to support taxpayers.

Please note as well that on April 1, 2020, the District of Ucluelet implemented the <u>Bylaw Enforcement Priorities During Covid-19</u> operational policy. This document prioritizes education and monitoring intended to promote compliance with COVID-19 related Provincial Orders and social distancing recommendations. It specifically addresses short-term accommodations and construction sites and provides best practices. As a reminder, note that the Province has defined COVID Essential Services.
