# Outdoor Burn Permit

## FIRE PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

<b>Duration of Burn</b>	The release of visible smoke must cease after 72 hours, or when instructed to do so by the Chief Administrative Officer, or those persons authorized by him/her.
<b>Smoke Free Period</b>	Open burning must be separated by a smoke free period of at least 15 days.
<b>Burn Periods</b>	Open burning can take place on the same land only 4 times per year.
<b>Weather Conditions</b>	<p>In all areas, open burning must only take place under the appropriate weather conditions. Weather must be conducive to dispersal of smoke, as specified by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) venting must be considered “good” on the first day of burning;</li> <li>b) venting must be considered “good” to “fair” on the second day of the allowable burn period; and</li> <li>c) piles must be clean and dry.</li> </ul> <p>Debris must not be added to the open burn if:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) weather conditions change and the ventilation index becomes “poor”;</li> <li>b) local winds make the dispersion of the smoke inadequate or</li> <li>c) any inversion forms trapping smoke near the surface.</li> </ul> <p>See BC Venting Index map for daily ventilation index:  <a href="https://governmentofbc.maps.arcgis.com/apps/webappviewer/index.html?id=6d288bc667b24528a5c1e3b4c0373d07">https://governmentofbc.maps.arcgis.com/apps/webappviewer/index.html?id=6d288bc667b24528a5c1e3b4c0373d07</a></p>
<b>Land Clearing Fires (Category 3 Burn)</b>	<p>Permit holder must register a Category 3 burn with the BC Wildfire Service in addition to obtaining this municipal burn permit.  <a href="https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/safety/wildfire-status/fire-bans-and-restrictions/ofts">https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/safety/wildfire-status/fire-bans-and-restrictions/ofts</a></p> <p>District Staff will check the Ministry of Environment’s ventilation index for the day the permit is to be issued:  0 - 33 is considered “poor”  34 - 54 is considered “fair”  55 - 100 is considered “good”</p>
