

#### RECOMMENDATION(S):

**THAT** the Harbour Authority direct staff to investigate and report back to Council regarding the incorporation of Harbour Authority meetings into regular Council meetings.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Traditionally the Harbour Authority holds regular standalone meetings at the time and place set out in Council's annual meeting schedule. The Harbour Authority holds additional meetings when necessary. Harbour Authority meetings tend to be short. Since Council members serve on the Harbour Authority, these meetings add several short standalone meetings to Council's schedule.

If Council and the Harbour Authority deem it appropriate, Staff would like to investigate integrating Harbour Authority meetings into Council meetings.

Staff anticipate dedicating a portion of four regular Council meetings per year to Harbour Authority issues. The Harbour Managers report would be presented at these regular meetings. The need for special Harbour Authority meetings may be eliminated, as Staff expect that Council may be able to move into the Harbour Authority on an as needed basis, much the same way that Council moves into Committee of the Whole during Council meetings.
